RANGE SET-UP

- 1) Target butts will be placed directly on the floor similar to the height of school butts.
- 2) If using target faces (paper), they must be an 80 centimetre FITA face with 10 scoring rings (NASP^{*} official target).
- 3) The bottom of the target faces will be attached to the butts approximately four-six inches above the floor.
- 4) The target line will be approximately two metres from the target butts.
- 5) There will be 10 metre and 15 metre shooting lines.
- 6) The waiting line will be at least four-five metres beyond the 15 metre shooting line. This will probably mean that you need to shoot the long way in your gymnasium.
- 7) An official NASP^{*} tournament is shot at a further distance than you have likely shot during class. Students wishing to compete in the tournament should have time to practice the longer distance (15 metres) before tournament day. This may mean some after-school shooting, should the gymnasium be free. If you wish to, you could also have everyone in class shoot 15 metre distance instead of the usual 10 metre distance. This will give every student the opportunity to see what a NASP^{*} tournament would look like.

GENERAL SHOOTING RULES

- 1) Archers will have two minutes to shoot each five-arrow end.
- 2) All arrows will be scored before any arrow (or the target's face) is touched or removed.
- 3) The archer at the target calls out the score of his or her own arrows, while the archer behind the Target Line records (bubbles) the score in pencil.
- 4) If archers cannot agree on an arrow's score, a range official must be asked to make the final decision.
- 5) The only bows permitted for use in this tournament are the standard, unmodified Genesis[™] bows approved for NASP^{*}.
- 6) The only arrows permitted for use in this tournament are the unmodified, Easton aluminum 1820 Genesis arrows.
- 7) Archers may wear finger tabs, tape, or gloves to protect draw-hand fingers.
- 8) Each archer will shoot one practice end of five arrows at 10 metres and then shoot three scoring ends of five arrows (15 arrow total) at 10 metres.
- 9) Each archer will shoot one practice end of five arrows at 15 metres and then shoot three scoring ends of five arrows (15 arrow total) at 15 metres.
- 10) An arrow that bounces off the target may be shot again, as instructed by range officials.
- 11) An arrow that reaches the target line without hitting the target is considered a shot and will be scored zero points.
- 12) An arrow that skips off the floor and embeds in the target is scored where it sticks.
- 13) An arrow that skips off the floor and bounces off the target, is treated as a bounce-out and may be re-shot.





TIES WILL BE BROKEN

- 1) Awards are given to the top five archers in each division. Therefore, a shoot-off for anything other than a top five position is not necessary.
- 2) It is very possible to have two archers with the same total score, but have a different number of 10s on their scorecard. The highest number of 10s will be ranked higher. Should archers have the same number of 10s, then move on to the number of 9s. Continue until the ties are broken. On the information submitted to the OFAH, the archer who is ranked higher after the tie-break, will be so noted.
- 3) If the tied archers' scorecards are identical in every way, a shoot-off will take place after all archers have shot.
- 4) Tied individuals will shoot a five-arrow warm-up end at 15 metres, followed by a five-arrow competitive end at 15 metres.
- 5) If the tie persists with both archers shooting the same total score, a single arrow shot from 15 metres, closest to the middle of the target's center will break the tie.

AWARDS

Individual awards will be presented to 1st - 5th place boys and girls in each division:

Elementary School (grade 4-5), Middle School (grade 6-8), and High School (grade 9-12).







TEAM COMPETITION

Each school may bring an unlimited number of participating archers. The top 12 scores from each school will automatically be entered in to the team event by the NASP Coordinator. (see below).

There will be an Elementary School team Champion.	(Grade 4-5)
There will be a Middle School team Champion.	(Grade 6-8)
There will be a High School team Champion.	(Grade 9-12)

If a school is small, and cannot make a Middle School team, Elementary students may be added to the Middle School team in order to reach the minimum team size of 12 archers. Should an Elementary student move up to shoot with the Middle School team, that archer's score may not be used on the Elementary School team as well. It will, however, be used as their score in the individual competition in the Elementary School division. Twelve different archers must make up the Elementary School team.

The top 12 scores from the team will count towards the school's score. The scores submitted as a team must meet the minimum requirements. Of the 12 scores submitted, at least four of the team members must be of the opposite gender. This means that the team may be one of the following:

8 boys and 4 girls • 7 boys and 5 girls • 6 boys and 6 girls • 5 boys and 7 girls <u>OR</u> • 4 boys and 8 girls.

Teams with gender compositions other than those described above (i.e. 9 and 3, 10 and 2, 11 and 1, or 12 and 0), will not be entered in the team portion of the competition.

Archer's individual scores shot during the event are used towards the team score. No additional arrows are shot by the archers for the team portion.

Only the top team from each age category will receive an award.
