



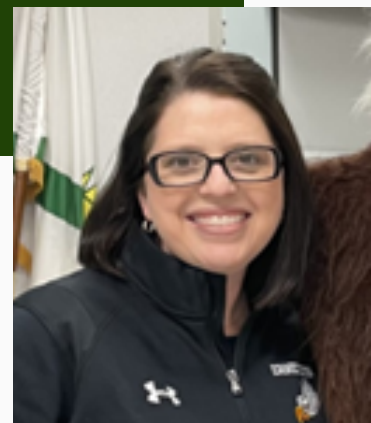

## Equity Matters at ESS...

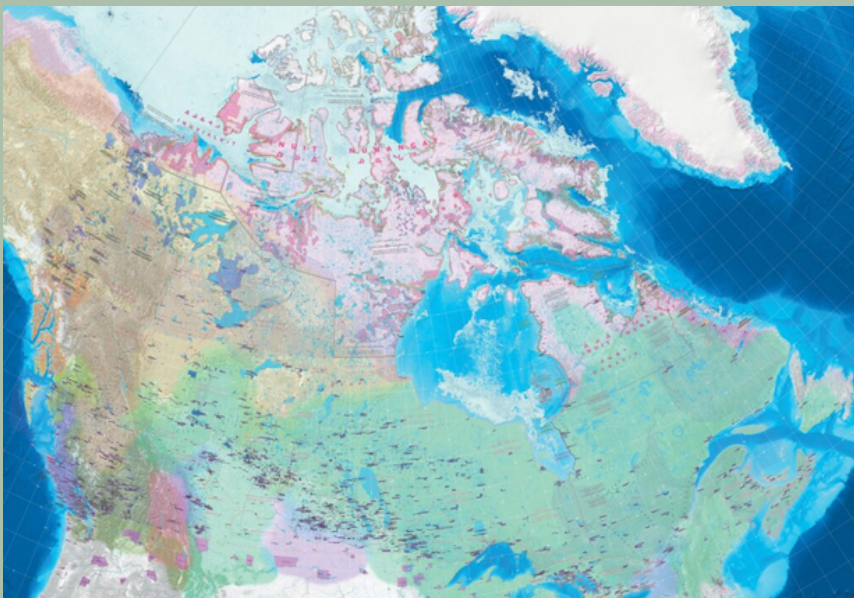
February is Black History Month and although this is officially celebrated for one month, schools and classrooms need to embed past and present Black excellence and histories throughout the entire year.

It is essential that we collectively question the lack of Black representation in learning resources, and counter that by amplifying past, present, and future Black Canadian changemakers and leaders.

During the month of February at Ernestown, we will highlight the contributions of Black Canadians through announcements, social media posts, music selections, and professional development opportunities for staff.



The 2023 ETFO Black History Month poster (artist Benny Bing) is a visual representation of the beauty that lies within Black features: specifically, hair, nose, and lips, that have been historically criminalized and degraded by white beauty standards. The sisterhood and solidarity on display, speaks to the relationships and mentoring that is so crucial in the Black community.
