Ms. Tyner and Mr. Wilson have been joined by Vice-Principal Steve Ward, who arrived at ESS last June. A graduate of Amherst Island Public School, Napanee District Secondary School and Queen's University, Mr. Ward is happy to "come home" by joining the ESS school community.

This is Mr. Ward's 28th year in education; he has been a Vice-Principal at four secondary schools, served for four years as Summer Session Principal and was the K-12 Vice-Principal of Special Education for Limestone DSB for five years. The *Survivor's Flag* is hanging in our school's foyer, and is an expression of remembrance. It is meant to honour residential school survivors and the many lives and communities impacted by the schools. Each element depicted on the flag was carefully selected by survivors from across Canada. Also pictured in the school's foyer is the *Every Child Matters* Flag. It is an expression of the belief that all children are important; this includes the children left behind at residential schools as well as those who survived but are still healing from the trauma they endured.

No one can take away any of your rights

Submit a human rights incident or complaint by using the **Student Human Rights Incidents and Complaints** form or by talking to your teacher, principal, vice-principal, or any LDSB employee.

Everyone is welcome at Ernestown Secondary School. As part of our ongoing work to ensure a safe, inclusive and equitable learning environment at ESS, staff and students recently viewed an LDSB-produced video focusing on Human Rights. The poster to the left has also been placed in classrooms and hallways.

Students can submit a *Human Rights Incident and Complaint Form* online when an incident involves Limestone student(s) or employee(s) for any of the following: hate activities, bullying (verbal, social, physical, cyber/online), and/or discrimination. The complaint form and additional information can be located on the LDSB website or simply scan the QR code to your left.

Limestone

A universal mental health support "quick link" was created on every secondary school website during the 2020-2021 school year. This link allows students equitable and timely access to the school-based mental health and well-being supports they require. When a student clicks on the quick link, it takes them to an electronic self-referral form. Once complete, these electronic referrals are submitted directly to the school Adolescent Care Worker & Social Worker.




