We are all born free & equal

Everyone has the right to live in freedom & safety

The Ontario Human Rights Code prohibits discrimination on the following grounds:

- Age
- Ancestry, colour, race
- Citizenship
- Creed
- Disability | Perceived disability
- Discrimination because of association
- Ethnic origin
- Family status | Marital status (incl. single status)
- Gender identity and gender expression
- Place of origin
- Reprisal
- Sex
- Sexual orientation

Your human rights are legally protected

The Ontario Human Rights Code is the human rights law in Ontario. You are legally protected from discrimination based on any of these grounds and have a right to an environment free from discrimination.

Host an International Student with Limestone!

Have you ever considered welcoming a student from another country into your home? The Limestone DSB has a proud tradition of hosting students from other countries, and we are looking to continue this growth during the 2025-2026 school year!

Hosting an international student is a highly rewarding experience! Limestone schools host more than 120 international students each year from countries such as Brazil, Italy, China, Germany, Czech Republic, Thailand, Hong Kong, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Spain, Turkey, Vietnam, Rwanda and others. Many life-long friendships have developed out of Limestone's international student homestay program. Some students come for one semester to improve their English and experience living in a new culture; others come for a longer period to prepare for entering a Canadian college or university. International students range in age from 12 to 17 years old.



We are currently looking for host families within the Kingston area for all lengths of stay ranging from four months to two years. Participating families are compensated with a monthly stipend of \$1050/month, paid tax-free at the beginning of each month. You must have a free bedroom in your home and be prepared to have a student enter your family.
