






Design Thinking Workshop

Limestone welcomes more than 120 international students each year from around the world. We are currently seeking Kingston area residents to open their homes to host secondary students. The students study in schools in the Kingston Area for September & February start times.

Students travel to the Kingston area to learn English or are here for a Canadian experience during the school year. Hosting an international student is very rewarding! Many lifelong international friendships have formed out of our homestay program. In addition, homestay families are compensated monthly, and are supported by the Limestone International Education Office full time friendly homestay staff.

Inclement Weather, Bus Cancellations & Exam Rescheduling

The Semester 1 Examination Schedule includes a day to account for potential inclement weather and bus cancellations. If buses are cancelled due to inclement weather, exams scheduled on that day will be rescheduled to the next exam day. Subsequent exams in the Semester 1 Exam Schedule will also be rescheduled to the next exam day.

For example, if buses are cancelled on Friday, January 26th, Friday's exams will be held on Monday, January 29th. Monday's exams would be held on Tuesday, January 30th, and so on.

In the event of inclement weather, it will be important for families to watch for communication about exam rescheduling. We will communicate with families through email and the school's social media accounts.


