#### **Washroom Update**

In response to an increase in reports of vaping, socializing, and vandalism in school washrooms, EISS school administration recently undertook a series of steps aimed at promoting positive and responsible use of student bathrooms. The first of these steps was to solicit student voice by launching a listening campaign in which students gave feedback on areas for improvement in washrooms and provided insight into the reasons for concerning bathroom behaviours. Student responses were compiled and shared with students at the last secondary Grade Forums. Beyond sharing this student voice data, these Grade Forums were an opportunity to reiterate expectations for bathroom use, and to clarify consequences for students who are socializing or vaping in the washroom. These consequences will include detentions, and may include suspensions for students who are repeatedly in bathrooms for any reason other than to go to the washroom. School administration also shared news at Grade Forums of plans to create a future lounge area in the school, and to add activities/games to the cafeteria to provide a more appropriate place for students to congregate.

Student safety is paramount, and acceptable use of washrooms is necessary for this to occur. We appreciate your support in ensuring the safety of all students by finding time to connect with your student(s) to reiterate the sole and obvious purpose of using a washroom.

- 2. You will see the "Spring 2025 Parent Teacher Conference" Conference listed.
- 3. Click on the date (April 9).

- 4. Click on the times under each teacher that you wish to book. It will be helpful to have your student's timetable showing the course codes with you to make sure you are seeing the correct courses/teachers.
- 5. Once you are done, you can print a list of the appointments that you have made by clicking the button to the right called "*Parent Conferences*"

Interviews are limited to **5 minutes** long and spaces are limited. If you require more time or are unable to attend, please contact the teacher directly via email (<u>see our website</u>) to make alternative arrangements.

Have you ever considered welcoming a student from another country in your home? The Limestone DSB and Ernestown SS have a proud tradition of hosting students from other countries, and we are looking to continue this growth next year!

Hosting an international student is a highly rewarding experience! Limestone schools host more than 120 international students each year from countries such as Brazil, Italy, China, Germany, Czech Republic, Thailand, Hong Kong, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Spain, Slovakia, Vietnam, Rwanda and others. Many life-long friendships have developed out of Limestone's international student homestay program. Some students come for one semester to improve their English and experience living in a new culture; others come for a longer period to prepare for entering a Canadian college or university. International students range in age from 12 to 17. We are currently looking for host families for all lengths of stay from four months to two years. Participating families are compensated with a tax-free monthly stipend of \$1,075/month (this amount will increase again in September 2026) at the beginning of each month.
